

Who is eligible for a SFCC photo ID/library card?

Community borrowers who are age 16 or older and do not have a Heartland Library Cooperative (public) library card will need to go to the Cashier's Office in Building B and pay \$5. Then they need to take the receipt and a photo ID to the Circulation Desk on the second floor of the LRC. The \$5 fee entitles community borrowers to a library card that is valid for five years and allows them to check out materials and use the computers. No one under the age of 16 will be allowed to have a SFCC library card or use a Heartland Library Cooperative library card.

Community borrowers who have a Heartland Library Cooperative (public) library card will need to take their card and a photo ID to the Circulation Desk on the second floor of the LRC so that it can be registered in our system.

High school juniors and seniors who are not dual-enrolled will need to go to the Circulation Desk on the second floor of the LRC to pick up a registration form that will need to be signed by a parent or guardian.

When they return the completed form to the Circulation Desk, they will need a photo ID.

If you should lose your SFCC photo ID, check at the Circulation Desk on the second floor of the LRC first. You may have inadvertently left it behind. If it is not at the Circulation Desk, go to the Registration area in Building B to get a replacement. It will cost \$5.
