

# Citation of Database Sources Using MLA Format

This is a suggested format for citation of an article from an electronic database. **Please check this format with your instructor before turning in a final copy of a paper.** Remember that the Works Cited list is alphabetized by authors' last names (or by title when a work has no author). For further help consult an MLA manual.

## E-Book

Author's last name, first name (initial if known). *Title of E-Book*. City of Publication, state or country: publisher, year of publication. *Name of database*. Web. Access date (day month year).

## ACADEMIC JOURNAL:

Author's Name (Last, First). "Title of Article." *Title of Journal* Volume.Issue (Year):  
Pages. *Name of Database*. Web. Date of access.

Gordon, Richard. "Religion." *Greece & Rome* 10.10 (2002): 262-69. *Academic Search Complete*. Web. 2 Jan. 2003.

## MAGAZINE:

Author's Name (Last, First). "Title of Article." *Title of Magazine* Issue number Date:  
Pages. *Name of Database*. Web. Date of access.

Cooper, Matthew. "Keeping His Eye on the Ball." *Time* 27 Dec. 1999: 128. *General OneFile*. Web. 23 Feb. 2009.

## NEWSPAPER:

Author's Name (Last, First). "Name of Article." *Name of Newspaper* [If the city is not included in the title of the newspaper, include it brackets after the title] Volume Date:  
Section page. *Name of Database*. Web. Date of access.
