In order to provide you with information related to attending South Florida Community College, the following reports, policies and general information are available to you upon request from the Office of the Dean of Student Services, Cornelius Complex Room 274, Avon Park. **Student Privacy Information:** The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) provides certain privacy rights to students related to educational records. This information can also be found in the

**College Catalog. College Graduation/Completion Rates:** This information concerns the completion/graduation and placement rates of all full-time students entering the College. A table of graduation rates is also available from the Office of Enrollment Management or the Office of Institutional Research.
