ADMISSIONS

SFCC has an open admissions policy. This means admission to the college is guaranteed to all eligible students. A regular high school diploma or equivalent that meets Florida standards is required for enrollment in college credit classes.

All applicants, including transfer students must have an official high school transcript or college transcript on file at SFCC before advisement and registration. A high school diploma is not required for admission to most other programs. Applicants 16 years of age or older and legally out of school may enroll in certificate or continuing education programs.

Students participating in early college/dual enrollment may enroll in a degree or certificate program upon meeting requirements. Some programs have limited space while others have special admission requirements. Due to limited space in some classes and programs, it is strongly advised that you register for classes as early as possible. For information, call the Advising and Counseling Center, 784-7131.

Request an Application for Admission and specific information from the Office of Admissions or any SFCC campus or center office. Placement testing is required of all degree-seeking and certificate students. You may be required to take additional tests based on those scores. Though admission is guaranteed, class registrations are handled on a first-come-first-served basis during designated periods.

STEP BY STEP ADMISSIONS/ADVISEMENT/ REGISTRATION

For New, Transferring, or Returning After Absence Students:

Step One: APPLICATION

- Apply online through www.southflorida.edu/admissions, or submit completed admissions application to the Office of Admissions at any campus or center.
- Verify residency status with the Welcome desk or reception staff.
- For identification purposes, you will be assigned a system-generated ID number that consists of nine characters and begins with X.

Step Two: TRANSCRIPTS

It is the *student's responsibility* to request

- Official transcripts from high school.
- Official transcripts from each post-secondary institution attended.
- An official GED score report from the appropriate issuing agency.

Step Three: ORIENTATION

Orientation is available at any campus or center and through the SFCC website. Contact the Advising and Counseling Center for details.

Orientation is required for *all new and transfer students* and must be completed prior to advising and registration. For details, call or visit the Highlands Campus, B-111, ext. 7410, Monday - Thursday, 8 a.m.-7 p.m., Friday, 8 a.m.-5 p.m.

Step Four: PLACEMENT TESTING

must be completed **prior** to advisement.

- Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (PERT) is administered for placement at any campus or center for students pursuing a degree. Official ACT or SAT test scores may be submitted for placement in degree and college credit certificate programs. Check with an advisor or counselor to see if additional testing is required.
- The Tests of Adult Basic Education (TABE) are administered at any campus or center for students pursuing an occupational certificate program.

TESTING DATES

Contact the Testing Center at 784-7214 for test dates or an appointment. **NOTE: The SFCC Application for Admission must be on file prior to testing.** Placement test scores and/or TABE scores must be on file prior to advising/registration. Sample test questions are available on the SFCC website, under Testing. Test scores are valid for placement purposes for two years only. Be sure to enroll in your required English and math courses while your placement scores are still valid.

A PHOTO ID IS REQUIRED FOR ALL TESTING. Pre-scheduling for testing is expected.

POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION

READINESS TEST (PERT): This test is required for degree-seeking students prior to registration, unless applicants provide appropriate ACT or SAT scores that are less than two years old. Students presenting ACT or SAT scores, which are below the cut scores, are required to take the PERT. If your scores on the PERT are below the 9.0 grade-equivalent level, you are required to take the applicable sections of the Tests of Basic Adult Education (TABE).

The PERT is scheduled at specific times throughout the week by appointment. Pre-scheduling is expected. For students who require special test accommodations, please contact the Disabilities Specialist before scheduling for appropriate referral 784-7131. The sub-tests include reading, writing skills, mathematics skills. Please plan on approximately three hours testing time.

TABE (Tests of Basic Adult Education): This test battery is required for all occupational certificate programs of 180 or more contact hours and for the Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) programs. Students with TABE scores more than two years old must re-test. Also, degree-seeking students must take the applicable portions of the TABE if their PERT scores are below the 9.0 grade equivalent level. The sub-test within the TABE are reading, mathematics, and language skills. Please plan on approximately three hours testing time for the full battery. The TABE is scheduled at specific times throughout the week. Schedule your appointment in advance to secure your place.

GED: Upon successfully passing the GED examination, students will receive a State of Florida High School Diploma. GED tests are held once a month. For information, contact the Testing Center at 784-7114.

CLEP (College Level Examination Program): CLEP tests are scheduled by appointment. Contact the Testing Center at 784-7114.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE ABILITIES TEST (CJBAT AND THE FLORIDA BASIC ABILITIES TEST (FBAT): The FBAT and CJBAT are for prospective law enforcement and correctional officers. One test is a paper and pencil version and the other is online. Both versions are offered weekly at the Testing Center. The test administration fee is \$35, and the test lasts approximately two and half (2 ½) hours. Photo identification and fee payment are required prior to test administration. Call the Testing Center to schedule your appointment 784-7114.

Panther Den Online (Desire 2 Learn)

Panther Den Online (or Desire 2 Learn or D2L) is the college's online learning support and course management system. It is 100 percent Internet-based, so you access it from any computer anywhere. The system features:

- Official SFCC student, faculty, and staff e-mail and instant messaging. This is the official communication method from your instructor to you. Please check the news items and your e-mail often.
- Up-to-the-minute SFCC news (any special events or school closings, etc.).
- Class resources, discussion boards, chat rooms, drop boxes, grades, and quizzes online.
- Storage is "virtually" on the Internet using the system "Locker" feature.
- A. In conjunction with Panther Central, you will have immediate access to club information, financial aid, registration tools, library, resources, the SFCC Student Handbook, and more.

Follow these instructions to view an online tutorial and access the system:

1. Connect to the SFCC Web site at *www.southflorida.edu*.
2. Click the Panther Central icon.
3. Log in to Panther Central, using your SFCC ID number (GID) that starts with an X. Your password will be either your birthdate for first time users or your PAWS PIN if you have been on before.
4. Click the My Courses tab and click the blue hyperlinks to access your courses found in Panther Den.

TUTORIAL SERVICES: Tutoring is available to all actively enrolled SFCC students through the Tutoring and Learning Center (TLC), on the first floor of the Learning Resource Center (Building Y), Highlands Campus. The Open Lab is in Y-101, the Math Lab is in Y-103, and the Writing Lab is in Y-105.

Tutoring and resource materials are available for many subjects but especially mathematics, writing, and reading. Students can work on specialized computer-based tutoring programs in the TLC or from any computer with Internet access. Math-related software is available in the Open and Math labs, while all labs provide remediation software for students who need to pass the PERT or TABE. Using software provided by the TLC, students can discover their unique study habits and learning styles. Staff then help students assess their results, develop learning plans for basic subjects, or prepare to take the GED or PERT. For more information about TLC services, call 784-7102, visit the TLC's program specialist, or stop by any SFCC campus or center.

Each term, all SFCC students receive one hour of free tutoring through the SMARTHINKING tutoring website. Students can interact live with a tutor, send any course-related writing assignments to the Online Writing Lab for review, or submit a question to any tutor for reply. Students can use the services around the clock by going to www.smarthinking.com and entering their Panther Den Online e-mail address as their user name and "1234" as their default password. For assistance, call the SFCC eLearning Department help desk at 784-7017, or send e-mail to onlinehelp@southflorida.edu.

Step Five: ADVISEMENT

- **All** new, transfer, returning–after–absence, degree, or college credit certificate seeking students must meet with a counselor/advisor or campus director.
- **All** returning–after–absence, occupational certificate or apprenticeship–seeking students must meet with a counselor or advisor, campus director, department chair, program manager, or appropriate faculty.

ADVISING ALERT

Continuing students on academic probation, students receiving VA benefits, and students currently taking or required to take college preparatory classes must meet with an advisor or counselor for registration for each term.

College Preparatory:

- Students who do not successfully complete a college preparatory course in two attempts will be required to pay a fee equal to out-of-state tuition for the third attempt (fourth attempts require special permission through an appeal process). The excess fee may be waived one time based on extenuating circumstances and financial hardship.
- After you have earned 12 hours of college credit, you must maintain enrollment in a college preparatory course until you have completed all preparatory exit requirements. If you drop from a college preparatory course during this period, you must drop from all other courses. You may not drop from a preparatory course without meeting with a counselor.

Recommended Course Load

Finding the Academic Load That's Right for You

To be academically successful, consider your individual lifestyle when planning your class schedule. Your personal responsibilities, employment, and other factors impact how well you perform academically. During the 16-week fall and spring terms, a 3 credit hour course normally meets three hours per week. To succeed, students generally need to study two hours outside of class for every hour in class. For example, if you take 15 credits, you'll need to devote about 45 total hours per week to your college classes. (This includes attendance and study time.) Dedicated students who work half time often succeed with a 12-17 hour load, but few students are able to work full time and succeed in a full-time course load.

WITHDRAWAL POLICY

It is your responsibility to officially withdraw from classes once you register and decide not to attend. A withdrawal is an "attempt" and a grade of W is awarded. If you are a financial aid recipient who withdraws from a class or a class is canceled after the regular registration period, consult the Financial Aid Office. If you fail to do this, you may be liable for the cost incurred.

STATE EMPLOYEE TUITION FEE WAIVER

1. Acquire a packet from any SFCC campus or center or through the college website.
2. Follow the guidelines.
3. Fill out the Intent to Apply form. You **MUST** list the courses, and you are limited to 6 credit hours.
4. The supervisor and agency head **MUST** sign **the form**.
5. Send the completed form to the Office of the Registrar one week prior to the last two days of registration for each term. A new form is required for each term.
6. You may register for only the courses listed on the Intent to Apply form.
7. All transcripts must be on file prior to registering for classes.
8. If you register for other classes, you are responsible for payment. If the State Employee Tuition Fee Waiver is used, SFCC requires that a new form is completed with the new courses listed and submitted to the registrar.
9. If you qualify for financial aid, financial aid will pay first and you may not be able to use the State Employee Tuition Fee Waiver.

Step Six: SCHEDULE COURSES, OBTAIN ID AND PAY FEES

All students are required to obtain an SFCC identification card. Student IDs are available through the Office of the Registrar, Building B, Highlands Campus or the nearest SFCC campus or center **after fees** have been paid.

Course Attempts (excluding college preparatory courses):

- You may register to audit a course only one time prior to registering for credit.
- You may enroll in a course a maximum of three times. You may not withdraw on the third attempt.
- Upon your third enrollment in a college credit course, you will be assessed a fee equal to out-of-state tuition. The excess fee may be waived one time based on extenuating circumstances and financial hardship.
- To register for a fourth attempt requires special permission through an appeal process.
- Students have a maximum of six months following completion of a class to file an appeal for a tuition refund or withdrawal from a class after the deadline.

You can determine all courses required for your major and plot the courses for each term in advance to complete your degree in a timely manner.

Notification of Social Security Number Collection and Use

In compliance with Florida Statute 119.071(5), SBE Rule 6A-1.0955(3)(e), South Florida Community College (SFCC) issues this notification regarding the purpose of the collection and use of your Social Security number (SSN).

SFCC collects your SSN for use in performance of the college's duties and responsibilities. To protect your identity, SFCC will secure your SSN from unauthorized access. SFCC will never release your SSN to unauthorized parties, and each student at SFCC will be issued a unique student identification number. Your unique student identification number is used for all educational purposes at SFCC including registration, access to your online record, etc.

Federal legislation relating to the Hope Tax Credit IRC Section 25A, requires that all postsecondary institutions report the SSN of all postsecondary students to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). This IRS requirement makes it necessary for community colleges to collect the SSN of every student. A student may refuse to disclose his/her SSN to the college, but refusing to comply with the federal requirement may result in fines established by the IRS.

In addition to the federal reporting requirements, the public school system in Florida uses the SSN as a student identifier. This use is authorized in Florida Statute 229.559 and in School Code Section 1008.386. In a seamless K-20 educational system, it is beneficial for postsecondary institutions to have access to the same information for purposes of tracking and assisting students in the transition from one educational level to the next.

All SSNs are protected by federal regulations and are never released to unauthorized parties.

Athletic Department

When the Athletic Department awards scholarships to prospective athletes who have not been officially admitted to the college and assigned a college ID, the scholarship award is reported using the athletes' SSNs.

Corporate and Continuing Education/Driver Education Program

Because of Florida state education reporting requirements, students who enroll in Corporate and Continuing Education and Driver Education classes are required to submit their SSNs. In addition, the Driver Education Program is required to provide a student's SSN to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicle after completion of specific courses.

For professional development and licensing classes, SSNs are used for state licensure reporting requirements. For adult education and Workforce grant-funded programs, SSNs are used as an identifier for program enrollment and completion.

Financial Aid Office

The Financial Aid Office at SFCC collects SSNs as mandated by the following: 20USC 1078; 20 USC sections, 1090, 1091, and 1092. Section 483 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (collection of SSNs of students and parents) 34 CFR 668.16, (administrative use) 34 CFR 668.33 (verify residency) 34 CFR 668.36, (verify with FAFSA). The Financial Aid Office at SFCC requires students to submit their SSNs on various forms to correctly identify applicants, match each applicant's financial aid record with the student record, and to help coordinate state and federal aid programs.

Human Resources and Payroll Offices

The college's Human Resources Department and Payroll Office's collect SSNs for the following purposes: classification of accounts; identification and verification; credit worthiness; billing and payments; data collection, reconciliation, tracking, benefit processing and tax reporting; and for fingerprint submissions to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. SSNs also are used as a unique numeric identifier and may be used for search purposes. Providing your SSN is a condition of employment at SFCC.

Institutional Research Office

The institutional research office uses SSNs for data collection and required annual state and federal reporting.

Outreach Programs

The College Reach-out Program (CROP) collects SSNs to track students for outcome data.

South Florida Community College Foundation, Inc.

The SFCC Foundation, Inc. collects SSNs for the following purposes: as a unique numeric identifier and for reporting scholarship recipients to the Department of Education and the Florida Community College Foundation. SSNs also are required by certain scholarship donors in accordance with their trust or scholarship agreements.

2. Enter your student ID number (X assigned number) in USER NAME box, (Your ID is nine characters beginning with an uppercase X followed by eight numbers. Do not type spaces or other characters) If you do not know your SFCC student ID, contact the Panther Central Help Line, Monday-Thursday, 8 a.m. - 7 p.m., and Fridays, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., at 863-784-7416 or 863-784-7134.
3. Enter your personal identification number (PIN/PASSWORD) in PASSWORD box. Click LOGIN. First-time users, your PIN/PASSWORD is your date of birth (MMDDYY). For example, if your birth date is Jan. 15, 1956, then your PASSWORD is 011556 (note the leading zero). After you log in for the first time, it is suggested that you change your password. Click My Account, and you will be prompted to create a new five to 20 characters PASSWORD consisting of alphanumeric no special characters. You will use this PASSWORD for all future logins. You will see three boxes on the screen:
 - a. Enter your current PASSWORD.
 - b. Enter five to 20 alphanumeric characters for your new PASSWORD.
 - c. Re-enter your new PASSWORD.
 - d. Click Save Changes.
4. Click STUDENT TAB.
5. Scroll down to REGISTRATION TOOLS. Click Add or Drop Classes. Select a Term press Submit
6. In the Add Class Worksheet section, enter all Course Reference Numbers (CRNs) then click SUBMIT CHANGES. NOTE All registration errors (time conflicts, prerequisites/test score errors, closed courses, etc) will be stated at the bottom of the screen and marked with a STOP sign. The reason the course(s) was not added is stated under the status column. Once you have registered, your schedule will appear on the screen. To search for specific classes, click CLASS SEARCH follow the directions on this page.
7. SFCC accepts MasterCard, Visa, and Discover credit cards. If you are at the registration screen and wish to pay online, click the PAY NOW button at the bottom of the registration screen. This screen displays the tuition and fees that you must pay to reserve your classes. Click the PAY NOW button and enter the payment amount Click Submit and follow the directions.
8. If you do not pay your fees online and want to receive your official bill, click RETURN TO MENU, and then click REGISTRATION FEE ASSESSMENT. This screen displays the tuition and fees that you must pay to reserve your classes. To receive your official bill, print this page, and present to the Office of the Registrar, the campus/center director, counselor, or Financial Aid Office.
9. Click MENU, and then click STUDENT DETAIL SCHEDULE. This screen includes all registered courses with day, time, location, instructor, etc. You should print and keep it for your information/reference.
10. For security reasons, click EXIT. Once you have completed registration, you must close your browser.
11. If you do not pay online, MAKE ARRANGEMENTS TO PAY YOUR FEES BY THE DEADLINE.

You can also check your financial aid status through Panther Central.

Step Seven: FINANCIAL AID

To be considered for financial assistance, students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). It is the applicant's responsibility to complete the application accurately and submit it as soon as possible.

The Financial Aid Office provides financial assistance to all qualified students who are attending SFCC. This assistance can be in the form of scholarships, loans, grants, student employment, and/or the combination of all. Financial aid is awarded on the basis of individual need, educational costs, academic merit, and the availability of funds. It is important to complete and submit all forms requesting financial aid assistance. The FAFSA must be submitted yearly to determine financial need based on federal regulations and information supplied by you and your family.

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is available online at www.fafsa.gov.

SFCC Federal School's Code is: 001522

Students who wish to use their financial aid towards their tuition, fees, and books must have met the SFCC priority dates for filing the FAFSA prior to registration. The SFCC FAFSA priority date is:

Summer Term - Mar. 15

Fall Term - April 15

Spring Term- Oct. 15

If files are incomplete once you register for classes, you must come prepared to pay all costs for enrollment. Once files are complete, you will be reimbursed, if eligible, to the extent of documented eligibility.

Disbursement of Funds

In accordance with federal law, SFCC may not disburse funds until after the end of the drop and add period for each term. At that time, your enrollment in college can be verified and your funds will be disbursed accordingly. For this reason, it is essential that you do the following:

- You must be in an eligible **Title IV Program of Study** as determined by the U.S. Department of Education, such as an Associate in Arts (A.A.) program and/or some selected certificate programs to be eligible to receive financial aid disbursements.
- Register for all of the courses you wish to take at the beginning of each term. If you drop or add a course, it may affect the amount of funds you receive.
- Set aside personal funds for the first few weeks of each term. Although you may be using your financial aid for living expenses, the Financial Aid Office cannot guarantee that funds will be disbursed at a designated time. You must budget properly to be sure you do not depend on funds that may not be provided at a specified time.
- Ensure your address is correct at the Office of the Registrar for accurate mailing of your check if you are unable to pick up your check at the Cashier's Office.

The disbursement of funds is a function of the Office of the Controller. Since it processes checks for the entire student population, it is impossible to grant special requests for picking up checks earlier than scheduled.

What if I paid my tuition on my own by cash, check, or credit card?

A student who pays tuition before the financial aid is awarded will be reimbursed some portion or all of their tuition payment, depending on the amount of the financial aid award.

- **Cash or check** – A reimbursement check will be mailed to your home address.
- **Credit Card** – A credit will be issued to your credit card account.

Withdrawals and Returning Federal Funds

Before you consider withdrawing from all classes, please read below:

In the Higher Education amendments of 1998, Congress passed provisions governing what happens to you and your federal financial aid disbursements when you totally withdraw from or stop attending all classes before the 60 percent point of term.

In general, the new law specifies that you are not entitled to 100 percent of your federal financial aid until you have completed at least 60 percent of the term. The following date represents the 60 percent points of each full term:

If you receive any federal financial aid and you withdraw or stop attending classes before reaching the 60 percent point of the term, you must repay a portion of the grant to the grant program.

Spring 2011 - Mar. 14, 2011

Summer 2011 - June 27, 2011

Fall 2012 - Oct. 31, 2011

SFCC will be required to return a portion of the federal funds you received. When this occurs, you will owe this amount to SFCC as unpaid fees. You will be billed for the unpaid fees, and your grades and transcripts will be held until all SFCC debts have been paid.

You must repay your Federal Direct Loan in accordance with the conditions on your promissory note. Any additional grant money you did not earn (Pell, ACG, or FSEOG), you must repay to the federal government and is considered a federal overpayment. You must either repay that amount in full to SFCC within 45 days of the date you are notified of the overpayment or make satisfactory arrangements with the U.S. Department of Education to repay the amount that is owed.

If you fail to repay or make satisfactory arrangements to repay a federal grant overpayment, you will lose further eligibility for **ALL** federal aid for attendance at any college. This loss of eligibility will continue until the debt is paid in full.

Failing Grades

If you have begun attendance and have not officially withdrawn or you fail to earn a passing grade in at least one course offered over an entire period, the

institution must assume for Title IV purposes that you have unofficially withdrawn, unless the institution can document that you completed the period.

If you unofficially withdrew from an institution that does not require taking attendance, your withdrawal date will either be the last day of attendance at an academically related activity or the midpoint (50 percent) of the enrollment period.

If you are considering a total withdrawal from your courses, you are strongly encouraged to contact your instructor. You may also receive assistance from any counselor/advisor at any of the SFCC sites. You are encouraged to make every effort to maintain attendance in your courses and to avoid withdrawing from your courses.

If you have any questions about this federal policy, please contact the Financial Aid Office.

Flex Schedule and Financial Aid

If you enroll in a flex session and have remaining financial aid, your financial aid will not post to your student account for that flex session until after the last day to drop with refund. Refer to the Schedule of Classes for the applicable dates.

Veterans' Benefits

Veterans are permitted to defer their tuition and fees once per year or after a break in attendance equal to or greater than one term. The period may be as many as 60 days. The total amount of fees deferred may be limited. Deferments must be paid on the date due or before the last day for dropping or withdrawing from a course, whichever comes first, whether or not the veteran student has received a check from the VA office. Call the financial aid officer at 784-7406 for further information.

DEGREE RECIPIENTS WHO RECEIVED FINANCIAL AID:

If you re-enroll the term following graduation or completions, a delay in our system may not reflect changes immediately. Therefore, you may receive additional funds in error for which you will be liable for repaying.

The registration process is **NOT** complete until fees have been paid.

Special Fees:

Several courses offered by SFCC require students to be insured while enrolled in the courses. Insurance fees are in addition to other special or laboratory fees.

Laboratory Fees:

Many courses offered by SFCC require the use of expendable resources or special equipment. Students enrolled in these courses are charged a laboratory fee to offset the cost of these resources and/or equipment.

College Credit Course Refund Policy:

Students are required to notify the college if they are dropping a course or withdrawing from the college. Refunds must be requested within the refund period; see College Calendar, pages 7-8. Fees paid by check will not be refunded until the student's check clears the college's bank.

Please note: This may take several weeks. All refunds are paid by college check.

Technical Programs Refund Policy

For classes of 150 to 1,320 hours, a student who officially drops before the end of the first calendar week of the term will receive a 100 percent refund of registration fees. For classes of 1 to 149 hours, a student who officially drops will receive a 100 percent refund when an official drop is received by the Office of the Registrar prior to the second class meeting, except in the case of single session classes, workshops, or seminars, when an official drop must be completed and received by the Office of the Registrar prior to the start of the class or activity. SFCC accepts MasterCard, Visa, and Discover for payment of fees.

Fees are subject to change without prior notice upon approval of the SFCC District Board of Trustees. All fees are due and payable in full at time of registration.

Admissions Fee:

A one-time user fee assessment of \$25 per student is required of each student who enrolls in one or more Advanced and Professional (A&P), Post-secondary Vocational (PSV), Post-secondary Adult Vocational (PSAV), and/or College Preparatory courses beginning fall term 2004 to help recover the costs associated with admitting a student to SFCC (admissions fee). Dually enrolled high school students, unless or until enrolled in regular program offerings, will be exempt from this student fee.

The admissions fee will provide each student access to parking, automotive vehicle decals, a student identification card with photo, and the library. Each student will be assessed this fee one time only upon enrollment in any of the aforementioned programs or courses. Students not enrolled in the aforementioned programs but enrolled in Adult Education (ABE, ESOL, AHS, GED Preparation), Community Education, Apprenticeship, and Continuing Workforce Education courses/programs will not be assessed the admissions fee unless or until enrolled in courses or programs where the fee is expected.

*Additionally, a \$5 fee is charged to help cover the cost of replacing a lost or stolen photo identification card and to provide new cards for students who wish to secure an identification card but are not expected to pay the admissions fee.

DIVISION OF ADULT AND COMMUNITY EDUCATION

The Adult Education Program is an integral part of the total academic program of South Florida Community College. A variety of courses are offered to meet the educational needs of district residents who are 16 years of age or older. These adult education programs are classified as follows:

1. Adult Basic Education (ABE)

This program upgrades educational skills in reading, writing, math, and other essential areas for individuals who are functioning up to the ninth grade level.

2. Adult High School (AHS)

A South Florida Community College High School Diploma is awarded upon satisfactory completion of this program and passing the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT).

3. English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

ESOL is designed for individuals who wish to improve their English skills and/or obtain U.S. citizenship. ESOL courses teach the basics of modern American English using the latest in adult ESOL materials. The focus is on conversational agility, fundamental, and formal grammar, life skills vocabulary, colloquialisms, writing skill, listening comprehension, and accent reduction. For additional information, contact the Division of Adult and Community Education, located in Sachsenmaier Hall, Building H, or call 784-7380.

4. General Educational Development Test (GED)

The General Educational Development Test is available to residents of Florida 18 years of age or older who do not possess a high school diploma (see item C below). The diploma (State of Florida High School Diploma) is awarded upon passing the GED examination.

Eligibility for G.E.D. Testing:

- A-1.** Take the complete battery of the Tests of Adult Basic Education (TABE). These include: Reading, Total Mathematics, and Language.
- A-2.** Register for the appropriate Adult Education class based on the TABE scores: ABE—at least one score below 9.0 and GED—all scores 9.0 or above.
- A-3.** Remediate and re-TABE as necessary.
- A-4.** When all TABE scores are 11.0 or above on the Level A tests, take the Pre-GED.
- A-5.** Remediate and re-take the Pre-GED as necessary until all scores are 450 or above and the total score is at least 2300.
- B.** Reside in Florida at the time application is made.
- C.** Be 18 years or older. Those who are ages 16 and 17 and not regularly enrolled in high school may take the test provided they have written recommendation from their home county school superintendent. For additional information, contact the dean, Division of Adult and Community Education, located in Sachsenmaier Hall, Building H, or call 784-7441.
- D.** Have submitted an application three days prior to scheduled test and paid the application fees.
- E.** A \$70 fee is charged for the full GED examination. Re-testing fees are assessed as follows: \$14 per section for social studies, science, reading, and mathematics and \$15 for the writing section.

Community Programs

SFCC is the provider of a variety of additional programs that meet the needs of the community.

Parents, Children and Divorce - The Parents, Children and Divorce class meet the Florida Statute requirements for parents with minor children who seek a divorce in Florida. It focuses on the concerns you have regarding your decisions in divorce and the impact this process will have on your child or children. You will learn effective ways of communicating with each other and of making decisions that are in the best interests of your child or children. SFCC is the designated provider of this training for DeSoto, Hardee, and Highlands counties. This four-hour course is offered monthly.

Driver Education Programs - SFCC offers a variety of driver improvement programs at four sites within the tri-county area.

Alcohol Drug Accident Prevention Training (ADAPT) - This four-hour course is required of all first-time applicants for a driver's license who have not completed a Florida Department of Education-approved driver education course. This course focuses on Florida's traffic laws and the consequences of substance abuse and its effects on your ability to drive responsibly.

Safe Driving Accident Prevention Program (SDAPP) - If you have received a traffic citation, you may register for the Safe Driving Accident Prevention Program. Successful completion of this four-hour course may prevent you from receiving points or paying the full civil penalty.

Both ADAPT and SDAPP classes are available in the Spanish language.

Eight Hour Basic Driver Improvement (BDI) - This course is required if you have received two traffic citations in a one-year period.

Advanced Driver Improvement (ADI) - Advanced Driver Improvement is a required course if you have accumulated sufficient points to result in license suspension. This 12-hour course concentrates on providing you with the tools to develop positive attitudes and behaviors while maintaining control of a motor vehicle.

Senior Citizen Driver Improvement Program (SCDIP) - If you are a Florida driver 55 years of age or older, you may receive an insurance discount upon completion of this course. The program focuses on accident prevention, Florida traffic laws, the effects of drugs and alcohol on driving performance, and the effects of aging on driving skills. For information about hosting a SCDIP class in your community or retirement park, call the Community Education Department at 863-784-7153.
