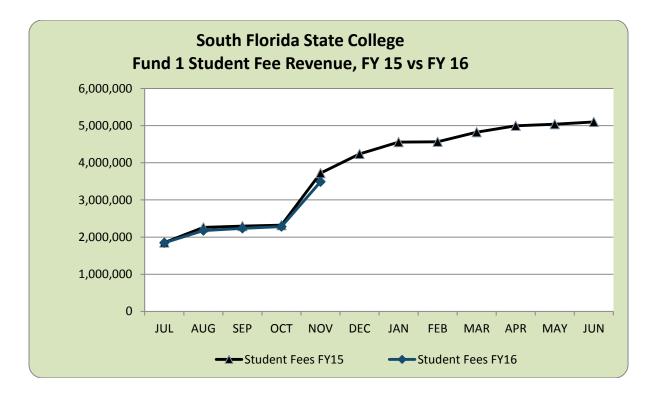


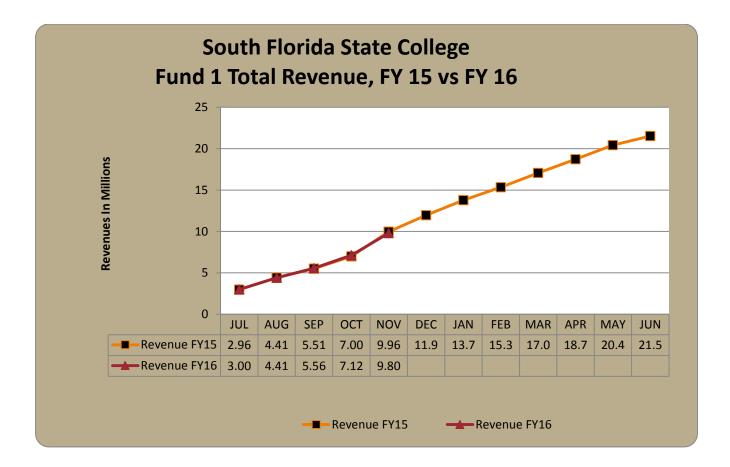

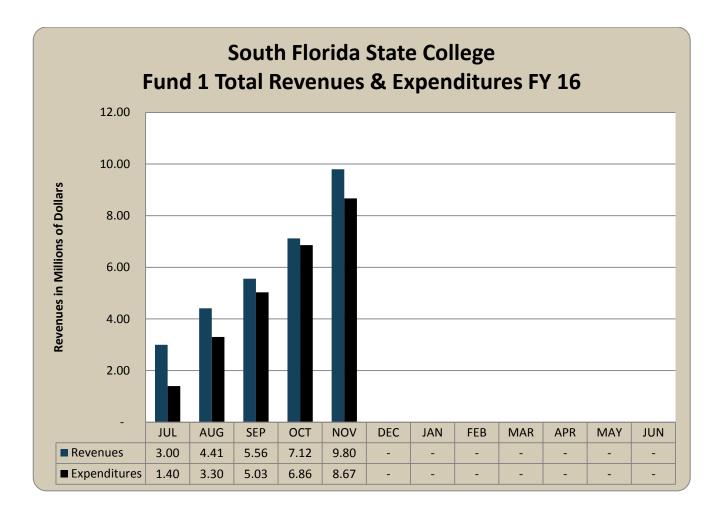

The number of gifts for our January report is up from our previous period, as well as the average gift amount, the number of constituents who gave and the average donation per constituent.

Our average donation with a year to date comparison is on the third chart. The average donation for January 1, 2015 to December 31, 2015 is \$671.61 with 1502 number of gifts reported. Our constituent average also increased from our previous report from 267 to 381.

IV. <u>Number of New Constituents YTD</u>

The number of new constituents and average donation for 2014 remains higher than our 2015 total. Total number of New Constituents in 2015 is 74 with an average donation of \$820.67.
