The criteria used to determine admission into the generic nursing (RN) program is as follows:

1. Completion of the 24 prerequisite hours with a grade of 'C', or higher, in each course and a cumulative program prerequisite GPA of 2.5, or higher. Prerequisite courses are as follows:

MAC 1105 – College Algebra (3 credit hours) or STA 2023 Elementary Statistics (3 credit hours)

ENC 1101 – Freshman English I (3 credit hours)

BSC 1085C – Anatomy & Physiology I (4 credit hours)

BSC 1086C – Anatomy & Physiology II (4 credit hours)

DEP 1004 – Human Development (3 credit hours)

MCB 2010C – Microbiology (4 credit hours)

PSY 1012 – Introduction to Psychology (3 credit hours)

2. Score of applicants' ATI® TEAS entrance exam for RN (ADN) programs. The ATI® TEAS (The Test of Essential Academic Skills) measures basic essential skills in the academic content area domains of reading, mathematics, science, and English and language usage.

3. In cases where all credentials are equal, the following criteria will be used in given sequence to determine who will be admitted into the program:

- a. Completion of any of the additional general education courses
- b. Residence in service district
- c. Completed application date
