The Lifetime Learners Institute (LLI) is endorsed by South Florida State College. It provides non-credit, educational, short-term sessions that foster the exchange of ideas and experiences in a collegiate setting.

Sessions are held some Thursdays (Oct. – Dec.) and every Thursday (Jan. – Mar.). Field trips are held monthly (Oct. – Mar.) and provide a relaxed environment for adults to develop new interests and enjoy opportunities for personal growth and social interaction with likeminded people.

Oct. 3 – Two field trips in one day (Non-Member – CRN 11425 / LLI Member – CRN 11423)

Destination – Koreshan State Park

Additional Fee – Non-member \$25 / LLI Member \$7

Ruth Fletcher will give us a guided walking tour, through the historic site, on a shelled pathway. The sect began in 1893 when believers relocated to Southwest Florida from Chicago. The Koreshan Community was self-sufficient, and surviving buildings include homes, a workshop, and a bakery.

• 2nd Destination – Lee County Solid Waste Recycling Center

We will take two tours of the facility covering the entire recycling process.

Kendall is the Project Manager for the "Orange Juice to Olive Oil" project that SFSC was awarded in 2017. Since January 1, 2018, Kendall and her team have worked to research the success of low-chill olive cultivars in Highlands and Hardee Counties. Session A & B: Kissimmee River Restoration Project

The Riverwoods Field Lab offers field-based environmental science and educational programs via pontoon boat. *The boat can hold a maximum of 14 participants.* We will learn about the Restoration Project that is restoring 43 miles of river and floodplain, wildlife habitats and improving water quality. You will see birds, alligators, and fish rebounding in the restored river. Box lunch included in trip fee.
