Program Description:

The College Credit Certificate in Emergency Medical Technician is a limited access program and designed to train you to become an Emergency Medical Technician. Upon completion, you will be eligible to apply to take the State/National certification examination. Some weekend and evening hours are required for clinical practice. Program content includes, but is not limited to, anatomy, cardiac care, medical emergencies, emergency childbirth, poisoning, shock, respiratory emergencies, and psychological emergencies.

Admission Requirements

This is a limited access program with admission requirements dictated by State, national, and local advisory committee standards. These additional requirements include, but are not limited to, the following:

1. Submission of the completed Public Safety Application (located online)
2. 18 years of age (verified by Florida Driver's License or other approved picture identification)
3. High school/GED graduate (verified by transcripts)
4. Program-approved physical examination, immunization history, and other required forms completed and submitted to the program offices
5. Background check and 10-panel drug screening

Class selection is completed approximately 4-8 weeks prior to the first date of class. Priority is given to applicants by the date the entire application process has been completed.
