Pre-Degree Requirements – Recommendations for Success

As outlined in the SFSC College Catalog regarding A.S. degrees: meet all program requirements; follow the program guided pathway outlined for you to ensure that you meet the 18 credit hours of general education courses and the suggested core degree requirements. If you need academic support (as indicated by lower scores on the ACT), meet with your advisor to determine co-requisite support courses.

Recommended Soft Skills

Integrity – the quality of being honest and having strong moral principles, moral uprightness

Communication – the ability to understand and be understood by others; to include communicating ideas to others, actively listening in conversations, giving and receiving critical feedback

Critical Thinking – The objective analysis of facts to form a reasonable judgement

Decision Making – The act of choosing between two or more courses of action leading to the solution of a problem using either intuition or a reasoned process or both

Conflict Resolution – The process by which two or more parties reach a peaceful resolution to a dispute.

Cooperation – The process of working together to the same end

Respectfulness – Due regard for the feelings, wishes, rights, or traditions of others

Emotional Intelligence – The capacity to be aware of, control, and express one's emotions, and handle interpersonal relationships judiciously and empathetically

Dependability – The quality of being trustworthy and reliable

Leadership – The ability of an individual to lead or guide other individuals or teams
