This program offers classroom instruction with hands-on laboratory experiences to teach students the principles of welding. The course is designed so students learn in a simulated work environment helping them become successful in several different areas of welding such as construction, fabrication, and shop manufacturing. Students are required to wear SFSC Welding uniform shirt, blue jeans, and safety shoes to every class. It is also required that students complete a 10-hour OSHA safety course before they may participate in lab activities. Upon completion of the 10-hour OSHA safety course, students will receive a certificate of completion and wallet size card. Students will be introduced to SMAW (stick), inert gas-shielded welding methods (MIG & TIG), Air Carbon Arc Gouging, Oxyfuel, and Plasma Arc Cutting, as well as a variety of hand and power fabrication tools. Upon completion, students have the opportunity to become an American Welding Society (AWS) FCAW (flux-core) 3G Certified Welder. Protective gear, three (3) SFSC Welding uniform shirts, basic welding tools, textbooks, 10-hour OSHA safety course, OSHA certified forklift operator course, and AWS Welder Certification fee is included in the cost of the course. Students will be responsible for purchasing ANSI Approved safety shoes (steel or composited toe boots) that must be worn during training.

You are a displaced homemaker no longer supported by the income of another family member and are unemployed or underemployed.

You are a former contract worker or self-employed individual who is unemployed due to current economic conditions.
