Pre-Degree Requirements – Recommendations for Success

1. Complete an Associate in Arts (A.A.) degree from a regionally accredited or equivalent college or university,
2. Complete EDF 1005, Introduction to the Teaching Profession, with a grade of C or higher
3. Earn a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale for all higher education classes
4. Demonstrate proficiency in foreign language.
5. Demonstrate mastery of General Knowledge Test, GKT
6. Pass a background check to include fingerprinting and drug testing
