Students getting a transfer AA degree who wish to specialize in English Education should fulfill all of the general education requirements and work in cooperation with the English faculty. English courses offered through the English/Humanities Department will provide content expertise. Given the statewide Florida Articulation Agreement, a completed AA degree will transfer to the upper division of Florida's public colleges and universities.

In order to place into ENC 1101-Freshman English I, acceptable scores on a placement test, successful completion of ENC 0026 and/or REA 0022, or exemption according to Florida State Board of Education Rule 6A-10.0315 is necessary. Students who, ultimately, want a bachelor's degree in English will take two terms of Spanish at the college level; those who want a B.S. in Education may not be required to take foreign language at the college level. The regular stipulation may apply: If the student has not completed two years of foreign language in high school, the student will add the foreign language requirement.
