



Program Description:

The purpose of this program is to prepare you to become a certified surgical technologist. Team members of the healthcare team, they work in operating rooms, ambulatory surgery centers, central supply, labor and delivery areas, cardiac catheterization laboratories, private physician offices, and other settings where invasive procedures are performed. This program is two years in length and requires classroom, laboratory, and clinical hours. Students are prepared to take the National Board of Surgical Technology and Surgical Assisting.

Pre-Degree Requirements / Recommendations for Success

- A. Completed online SFSC College and Surgical Services Application
- B. Demonstrate competency in English, reading and Math as prescribed in the SFSC College Catalog
- C. Submission of all official transcripts, including high school/GED transcript and official transcript from each college attended
- D. Placement test scores from any one of the following tests: ACT, SAT I ®, PERT
- E. Submission of three reference forms completed by the applicant's current or most recent employer, an instructor/professor, or a person of the applicant's choice that is not a relative (form available on nursing program website). These must be received at the nursing department in a sealed envelope.
- F. Prior to final acceptance and enrollment, the applicant must submit:
 - a. Record of physical health exam and immunizations from a licensed physician or nurse practitioner (forms will be provided after contingent acceptance into the program).
 - b. Florida Department of Law Enforcement fingerprinting (will be scheduled prior to enrollment).
 - c. Results of 10-Panel Drug Screen

Surgical technologists are allied health professionals who are an integral part of the team of medical practitioners providing surgical care to patients in a variety of settings. The surgical technologist works under medical supervision to facilitate the safe and effective conduct of invasive surgical procedures. This individual works under the supervision of a surgeon to ensure that the operation room or environment is safe, that equipment functions properly, and that the operative procedure is conducted under conditions that maximize patient safety. Job titles include Surgical Technologist (Tech), Scrub Tech, and First Assistant,
