Program Description:

This limited access certificate program focuses on the theory and practice of fires and firefighting. Upon completion of this program, you will learn how to safely perform the tasks of a firefighter in emergencies and in the fire station. Some topics covered include instruction in fire chemistry and physics, combustible materials, perform search and victim removal methods, building construction, fire codes and related laws, occupational safety, and equipment operation. Eligibility to take the state certification examination requires successfully completion of the required courses and meeting the Bureau of Fire Standards and Training application requirements. Florida Statutes require this certification for employment in the fire service. The SFSC Firefighter program is accredited by the Florida Bureau of Fire Standards and Training.

Admission Requirements

This is a limited access program with admission requirements dictated by State and local advisory committee standards. Minimum fire standards as required by Section 633.412, Florida Statutes (F.S.) you must:

- be at least 18 years of age
- have a high school diploma or GED
- pass a medical physical as outlined by the Bureau of Fire Standards and Training
- submit a notarized non-user of tobacco affidavit
- complete both SFSC and Firefighter I/II admission applications

All student seeking certification will be required to submit fingerprints for evaluation by the Bureau of Fire Standards and Training to ensure compliance with Florida Statute and Administrative Code.
