BSEE Admission Requirements

In addition to fulfilling the general entrance requirements to South Florida State College, applicants must meet the following requirements, consistent with Florida Statute 1004.04:

- 1. Complete an Associate in Arts (AA) degree or the equivalent, including all general education requirements and required Florida mandated common course prerequisites. Students with a minimum of 60 transferable hours, with all general education requirements and prerequisites met, may apply for admission.
- 2. Complete the lower-division prerequisite course, EDF 1005: Introduction to the Teaching Profession, with a grade of C or higher.
- 3. Earn a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale for all higher education classes.
- 4. Pass at least two subtests of the General Knowledge and miss less than 10 points on the failed subtests. To sign up for the General Knowledge Test, visit the website: fl.nesinc.com.
- 5. Demonstrate proficiency in a foreign language. Students may do this by completing two years of high school instruction in the same foreign language or by completing a minimum of eight college-level credits in one foreign language, per Florida Statute 1007.262.
- 6. Complete an interview with the BSETE Lead Instructor.
- 7. Pass a background check to include fingerprinting and drug testing. At SFSC, this is only required after you are conditionally accepted. Background checks are conducted by a local school board and must completed by Sept. 1. The cost is approximately \$100.
