1/16/2025 (Thursday) A: 9 – 10:15 a.m. SFSC Avon Park Campus University Center B: 10:30 – 11:45 a.m. SFSC Avon Park Campus University Center	A: Florida Everglades Python Hunter, Jason White: Jason, a dedicated python hunter, became passionate about tracking these invasive snakes due to the alarming impact they've had on the Everglades. Burmese pythons, likely introduced by both pet owners releasing them into the wild and hurricanes damaging pet facilities, have decimated local wildlife. In fact, studies show that these pythons have consumed up to 90 percent of certain mammal species in parts of the Everglades. With each female python capable of laying between 50 and 100 eggs at a time, their population is growing rapidly, further threatening the delicate ecosystem of this unique region. The hunt for pythons is crucial to protect and restore balance to the Everglades. B: SFSC Biology/Anatomy & Physiology/Botany Professor, Dr. Korn Jennifer received her Ph.D. in Wildlife Science from Texas A&M University-Kingsville where she created the first genetic pedigree for the federally endangered ocelot in South Texas. In 2013, she moved to Florida to take the position of Florida Panther Specialist with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission (FWC), where her work focused on the panther population north of the Caloosahatchee River. In 2017, she began working for Johnson Engineering, Inc., and collaborates with Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), private landowners, and other partners to monitor for panthers north of the River using remote cameras, and conduct research on design and locations of wildlife crossings.
