



## AUTHORIZATION TO USE TITLE IV FUNDS 2025-2026

Federal Regulations require South Florida State College to use Federal Title IV Funds (Financial Aid) to pay your tuition and fees. South Florida State College must obtain authorization from you before performing the following:

- You have the right to use Federal Financial Aid funds to pay for non-allowable charges, such as, but not limited to book charges, dorm rent, library and parking fines.
- You have the right to apply Federal Financial Aid funds to prior year charges, not to exceed \$200.
- You also have the right to request that South Florida State College hold your Federal Financial Aid excess funds for future term charges. (A written request must be submitted.)

I understand that I may rescind or modify this authorization by submitting a written request at any time to South Florida State College's Financial Aid Office. I authorize South Florida State College, over my full course of studies, to apply my Federal Title IV Funds as indicated above.
