The Donald Ross-designed course made history in 1959 by hosting the first nationally televised PGA event and later drew professionals like Arnold Palmer for major tournaments. Though the original hotel is gone, the semi-private club continues its legacy as a cherished part of the Florida Historic Golf Trail. *Lunch at Sandhill Grill at Pinecrest Golf Course*
